The C'mon Festival returns to downtown Edmonton for some serious classical music fun this summer. You can expect a unique musical experience: adventurous, surprising and genre-blurring. Renovations to the Winspear Centre have put us back on the street, so we'll be heading to a variety of locations: the concerts will be

“Here, There & Everywhere”! As always, admission is “pay what you can”.

All the performances will feature the seven-piece C'mon Ensemble – some of Edmonton's finest classical musicians. On **Wednesday, July 12** the musical hijinks begin with an outdoor set in Winston Churchill Square, in partnership with the Edmonton International Street Performers Festival.

On **Friday, July 14 and Saturday, July 15**, we'll head a couple of blocks over to All Saints' Cathedral (10035 103 Street) for two eclectic programs spanning more than three hundred years. A highlight will be David Baker's “Homage à L'Histoire” – African-American music inspired by Igor Stravinsky's “The Soldier's Tale”.

And finally, on **Monday, July 17** we will wrap things up with a noon-hour concert at the Stanley Milner Library.
